What you need to do

1 Complete this application form

First time applicants will also need to complete a firearms safety course as outlined in the 'Arms Code'.

Licence renewal applicants will also need to complete the multiple choice safety test on the back of this form.

2 Attach your application fee receipt

Fees are payable at a PostShop, fees can be obtained by contacting your nearest Police Station or online at:

3 Provide two recent colour passport photos

4 Deliver your application to Police

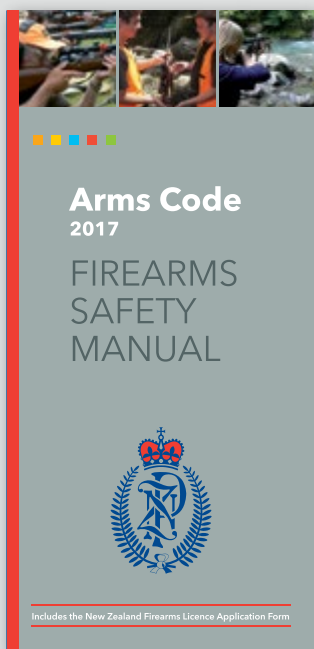
ARMS OFFICE CONTACT

What happens once we have your application ...

- A background check will be carried out.
- A vetting officer will contact the applicant to arrange an interview and complete a security check.
- A vetting officer will interview the applicants referees.

What else you need to do ...

- You will need to have a good understanding of the 'Arms Code' and what is required of you to use a firearm.
- You will need to provide a safe and secure place to store your firearms (see the 'Arms Code').



The 'Arms Code' forms the basis of the Firearms Safety Test which must be sat by all firearms licence applicants.

Renewal of Firearms Licence – Safety Test

If you are renewing your firearms licence you are required to complete the multiple choice safety test set out below.

Answer all of the questions below carefully and clearly mark your answer like this or

1. Before accepting a firearm from another person, the safe shooter will first

- A ask the person to point the muzzle in a safe direction, close the action and squeeze the trigger.
- B check the safety catch has been applied.
- C ask the person to open the action and demonstrate that it is not loaded.

2. The phrase 'with the muzzle pointing in a safe direction' is best interpreted as 'the muzzle pointing

- A upwards'.
- B downwards'.
- C in a direction where no person is likely to get shot'.

3. To reduce the risk of being shot accidentally while hunting, especially in dimly lit conditions, it is advisable for the shooter to

- A keep to open areas where other hunters can easily identify them.
- B not carry anything that could be mistaken for part of a game animal.
- C wear brightly coloured gear.
- D only make sounds and movements that are obviously human.

4. A safe shooter is someone who has
